Key Practices During Ramadan



Fasting (Sawm):

Muslims abstain from food and drink from sunrise (Suhoor) until sunset (Iftar). Fasting teaches self-discipline, empathy, and gratitude.



Prayer (Salah):

In addition to the five daily prayers, Muslims perform extra nightly prayers called Taraweeh during Ramadan.



Charity (Zakat & Sadaqah):

Giving to those in need is a central part of Ramadan. It reinforces the spirit of compassion and community.



Reflection and Community:

Ramadan is a time for spiritual renewal, reading the Quran, and strengthening bonds with family and community.

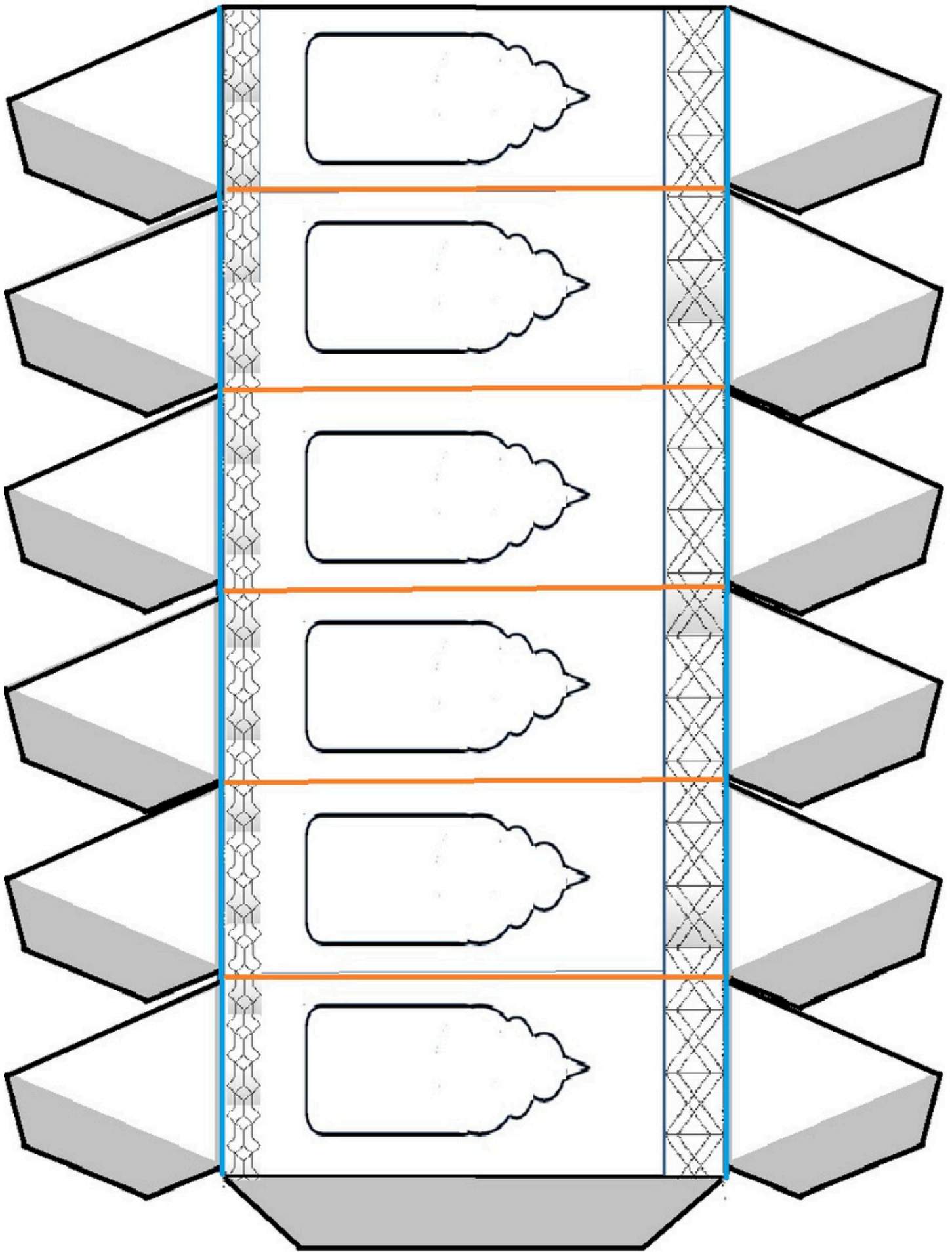
Fun Fact
