Canada	Parades and cultural events	Montreal hosts one of the oldest parades
Australia / New Zealand	Festivals and public events	Celebrations in major cities
Argentina	Street festivals and music events	Large celebrations in Buenos Aires
Japan	Cultural parades and family events	Celebrations organised by Irish cultural groups
Europe	Landmarks lit green, festivals	Celebrations across many cities

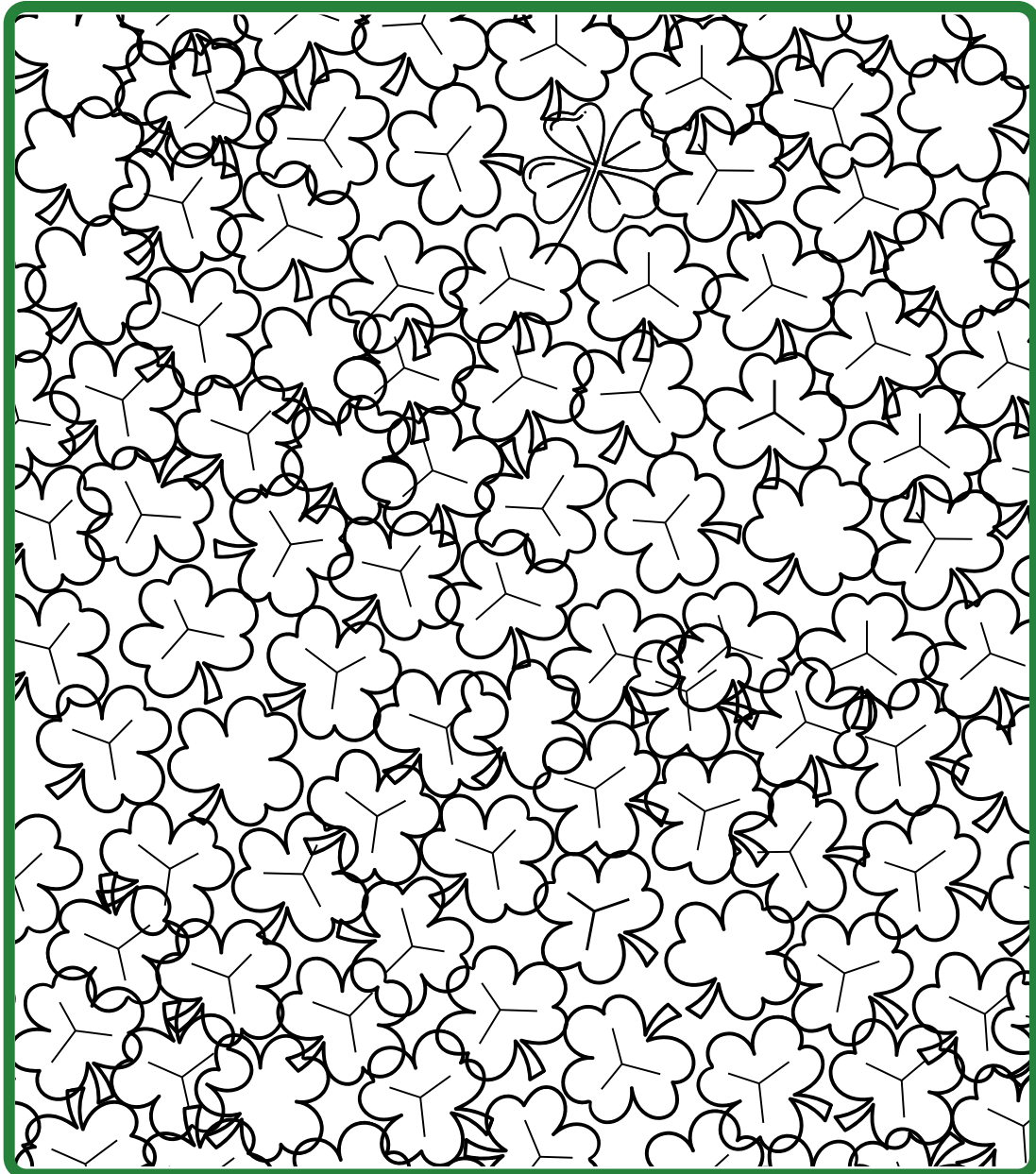
